Qualifying rounds draw 82,710 fans to Circuit of The Americas™ as Red Bull's Sebastian Vettel claims pole position for the FORMULA 1 UNITED STATES GRAND PRIX

AUSTIN, Texas (Nov. 16, 2012) – Formula 1[™] fans from around the world gathered at Circuit of The Americas today to watch two-time World Champion Sebastian Vettel of Red Bull Racing claim pole position for the inaugural **FORMULA 1 UNITED STATES GRAND PRIX**. Sunny, cool weather greeted the crowd of 82,710, which arrived steadily through the morning hours and peaked as qualifying for Sunday's Grand Prix was underway.

Vettel, who leads the drivers' standings, recorded the fastest lap time of 1:35.657 with fellow World Champion Lewis Hamilton of Vodafone McLaren Mercedes placing second with a time of 1:35.766. Vettel's teammate, Mark Webber grabbed position three on the grid with a time of 1:36.174. The FORMULA 1 UNITED STATES GRAND PRIX concludes Sunday, Nov. 18, with pre-race festivities kicking off at 12:30 p.m. CST and the race set for a 1 p.m. start. Circuit gates open at 7:30 a.m. Country music artist Clay Walker will perform a free concert for fans in the Grand Plaza following the Formula 1 race.
